

SECRETARY J A I N A CONFERS WITH JAIN LEADERS IN UK

London, UK. Dr Sulekh Jain, secretary, Federation of Jain Associations in NA, travelled to London, England on October 13, 1987 for the promotion of a unified common goal between Jain communities on both sides of Atlantic.

The meeting was held on October 14 at 11 Lindsay Dr, Harrow, and was attended by messers Ratilal Chanderia, H.D. Gardi, Nitin Mehta, Chief H.Bhandari, Mansukh Shah, Jagdish Jain, Vinod Udani, Ramnik Mehta, B. L. Jain, Vinod Kapashi, Prithvi Jain, and Mrs Pushpa Jain and many more ladies. Sulekh Jain presented to the meeting details of various Jain societies in NA and about the founding of the Jain federation, and talked on the common issues Jain communities are facing in the western world. May of the participants at the meeting expressed similar and other views to strengthen the line of communication and link between Europe and north America in order to address the issues that affect the Jain communities on both sides of Atlantic. The result is the 10-point program.

1 - Establish Jain Libraries in UK and NA and make available a common book for Jain Rituals. 2 - Jain Digest to enlarge news coverage and circulation in UK. 3 - Publish Directory of all Jain organisations on a global basis. 4 - Exchange of visits of Jain community leaders 5 - Jain Youth exchange program and common youth camps. 6 - Arrange and coordinate visits of Jain scholars from India. 7 - Set up of Jain Federation of UK similar to JAINA. 8 -Publish Jain quality books in English. 9 - Compile a list of available videos, film titles, produced anywhere, on Jainism. 10 - Organise convention of European and north American convention.

SHETH MANICKCHAND FATHER OF JAIN DIRECTORIES

Bombay. For the past decade or so, various Jain communities in India and in north America have brought out Jain directories, and in USA, Jain Center of Greater Boston in Massachussets pioneered in publishing Jain Directory of North America in 1971, championed by Dr Vinay Kumar Jain.

It is a tradition among Jains since decades and decades to compilestatistical data for a demographic survey presentation. And Jain historical records show that one unique individual, Sheth Manickchand, a well known diamond merchant and widely respected philanthrophist is the Father of Jain Directories.

This first of its kind Jain Directory was published in the year 1914 by Sheth Manickchand at a cost of Rs.15,000. Ever since, the trend to publish Jain Directories has profusely progressed with improved statisticcal and analytical data. The collectiveness of the various Jain communities as a single family stands strengthened in the process begun by Sheth Manickchand.

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BASADIS/DERASARS IN PAKISTAN

Nagar Parkar, Pakistan. Since 1947, the year Pakistan was carved out of India, there is no data to show that Jains, or the Jain community exist in Pakistan. But there are numerous indications in Pakistan to prove that Jain Religion thrived once in the region from Sindh to Baluchistan Even today the presence of Jain Religion and culture can be felt with Basadis, the Jain temples also known by the term, Derasars.

Nagar Parkar county in Tharparkar district was once a prominent cen ter of Jain Religion. Numerous remains of Basadis are scattered in the county. Umarkot Basadi, from where the idol of Lord Parshwanath was stolen in 1955, drew wide publicity at the time. Pakistani nationals went on protest at the time to condemn this act. I have examined the accompanying fund balance of Federation of Jain Association in North America as of July 31, 1987 and the related statement of revenue and expenditures (cash basis) for the period then ended. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly, included such test of the accounting records and other such auditing procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1, the Federation of Jain Association in North America uses the cash basis of accounting which recognizes income when collected and records certain expenses when paid. The organization has also prepared its statement of fund balance in a form prescribed by the Federation of Jain Association. These practices differ in some form from generally accepted accounting principles. This report is solely intended for the directors of the Federation of Jain Association in North America and not intended for any other purpose.

In my opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Federation of Jain Association in North America on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1: Major Accounting Policies

The Federation of Jain Association in North America uses the cash basis of accounting to record its revenue and expenditures. Under the cash basis of accounting, revenue is recorded when collected and certain expenses are recorded when paid. Accordingly, the revenue and expenditures reported by Jain Association in North America represent cash receipts and disbursements for the period ended July 31, 1987.

Note 2: Revenue and Expenditures

The Revenue and Expenditures Accounts consist of \$3,456.21 and \$2,145.83 in Canadian currency respectively. These amounts were converted to U.S. dollars at an exchange rate of \$0.74 (U.S. dollar) in effect on July 31, 1987.

Note 3: Jain Digest Patron

This account is restricted for Jain Digest and consists of \$1,902.00 (Canadian currency) which was converted as described in Note 2 above.

Note 4: Accounts Receivable

This account consists of amounts due from members and advertisement. (See List attached).

Book Review: LORD MAHAVIRA

Perhaps this is the first pictorial book written primarily for children living outside India. The original author Dr Kumarpal Desai, a well known Gujarati professor and a journalist from Ahmedabad, India, has written the biography of Lord Mahavir in simple and understandable language as it is geared for children in their early years of schooling. The 20-page book has illustrative narration with a picture or two drawn. The English translation of the title is by Vinod Kapashi and the pictures are beautifully produced by Rajni Vyas.

The book will definitely be welcome by the children as well the parents and it could be used as a good classroom material for teaching.

Over all, the book, Lord Mahavira is good in all respect. However, on page 18 the pictures and the narration would definitely raise certain questions about its relevency or irrelevency in the minds of the children because the Human Phenomena in Jain Faith preempts all other things. This is one negative aspect, I think, contradicts the human phenomena the Jain religion and philosophy speak of. It is a great book for children in the west and the efforts of Kumarpal Desai and Vinod Kapashi are commendable. I hope more such publications will come from them in the future. All Jain societies could encourage their effots through buying the book, Lord Mahavira.

Some Points in Jain Teachings

Count Arnold Keyserling

The first clue to the message of Jainism is given in its name derived from jina which means 'a conqueror.' The Jain wants to conquer his own personal life, whatever it might be. He venerates only the people who, as he knows, have achieved the He therefore follows the Tirthankaras as his guides. If he attains the goal, it will mean that his personal essence or soul has reached immortality.

The Jain starts from the premise that there exists a great number of individual beings, that all these beings could one day achieve immortality, and thus the right attitude for the Jain is to strive to attain his personal fulfilment, and also, at the same time, to help others to achieve their individual fulfil-This is the metaphysical kernel of the teaching of Salvation lies not only in attaining a state, or in Mahavira. following a moral precept, but in developing the individual being whoever and whatever he might be to its utmost fulfilment. Only in achieving this fulfilment, man will serve as a link between striving nature and perfected beings.

From this emerges clearly the purpose of human existence. Man has an inner essence, a "soul." The right attitude towards this soul is given in the doctrine of Ahimsa: it is wrong to hinder the development of this soul So Ahimsa means not only something negative-as refraining from killing and doing injury-but also something positive: it means to take the existing being, whatever and however it might be, as the starting point. Souls have certain characteristics, certain possibilities. Owing to individual achievement and Karma, each soul has a definite personal way. And it is this personal way which should be accepted as the basis of human society.

But not only the human being has a soul in this sense; every animate being even every existing phenomenon of nature has as its ultimate cause a divine spark, which one day may also develop and pass through the human form to attain its individual immortality. Thus Man stands not against nature—he is the real pontifex maximus linking, in his striving, the earth with the heaven, if he achieves the goal.

Why did Mahavira and many of the earlier Tirthankars start and continue their life and teachings as ascetics? Because Man tends to confuse the means with the ends Man is perishable on earth. If he identifies himself with his earthly possessions, he will lose himself. Thus the discipline of asceticism is a method and a means, it is not an end. It serves to liberate the human essence from its attachment to animal impulses and instincts.

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
